"He [Jesus] answered them, "When it is evening, you say, 'It will be fair weather, for the sky is red.' And in the morning, 'It will be stormy today, for the sky is red and threatening.' You know how to interpret the appearance of the sky, but you cannot interpret the signs of the times."

Matthew 16:2-3

One influence that convinced me knowing religious trends can aid ministry came from research showing the U.S. experienced a huge, one-time spike in church participation following World War II. In the 1990s it was almost impossible to avoid that fact when reading church literature, yet the stories congregations and pastors told about their churches' recent past were disconnected from that powerful, nationwide impact.

The U.S. Church isn't alone in this kind of disconnect. Universities can predict some changes in student enrollment based on population figures. The Boomers were our largest generation, then their children created another, smaller bubble, then their grandchildren, etc. Yet many colleges failed to plan for smaller cohorts; as a result, some have closed.

These situations strike me as I read headlines that herald a "Christian revival" among young adults in mainline churches. Unfortunately, research shows there aren't real signs of a "revival." Instead, the gigantic exodus of young adults who decide they are "done with church" has finally levelled. In 2019, 66% of adults in their twenties stopped attending altogether, while others dropped from regular to infrequent attendance. Today the return rate among twenty-something adults is up to 20% higher, though the percentage varies by region. Despite this improvement, too many young adults are still leaving church behind.

We've experienced some of that positive change here in Honeoye Falls. We may be getting a higher-than-average influx of young families because other congregations don't have the community involvement and in-church supports that we've worked hard to maintain. For me, it feels good to see more new worshipers and speak each Sunday with more children. I believe that if so many members hadn't kept faith and worked hard to expand our ministries then we wouldn't enjoy today's notable resurgence in church participation.

At the same time, the fact that this feels like a revival shows how low my expectations have become (which is, again, a sign of larger decline). One of the researchers I interviewed - Ryan Burge - has made it his mission to warn churches not to become too complacent. The crude phrase for long-term, congregational stability is "generational replacement." Churches like ours benefit greatly from the extremely strong support of the Boomer Generation. Statistically, they participate in higher numbers, more often, and more generously than other generations.

They are called "Boomers" because they represent our largest-ever baby boom - which means that no other generation can replace them. Ryan wants to ensure we do not pin false hopes on a slight turnaround in a much smaller generation. In other words, there is still an enormous gap between the participation rate of Boomers and the Gen Z church returnees.

He writes of a "membership cliff" that mainline congregations will face across the country once the Boomers can no longer participate. The slight uptick in Gen Z returns will seem to vanish, statistically swallowed by the new reality of dying, long-term members.

Forewarned is half prepared; First Presbyterian Church of Honeoye Falls can plan for this change. The main difference between our church and new, larger congregations is the outreach to and inclusion of immigrants, persons of color, and lower-income households. Those three groups are expanding in number while the stereotypical Presbyterian - who doesn't fit those demographics - is a shrinking percentage of America. There are vast, rich opportunities to expand church size and stability; they simply require new ways of thinking about who we proactively welcome and how we do so. Interestingly, that's the same thing Jesus told us to do when He said, "Go, compel them from the hedges" to sit at Christ's table (Luke 14:23). I suspect that if we make inroads in these areas, we will also experience brand-new, rich blessings. We'll never know unless we try!

Reasons for and Reasonableness of Per Capita

As Presbyterians, we agree to pay a "per capita" (or "per person") amount every year. The total amount is set by our Presbytery, which receives most of that allotment (smaller portions go to Synod and General Assembly). It pays for the support we receive from our Presbytery, including trainings, grants, infrastructure, help identifying new pastors, and free advisors when we need outside help.

Relative to other denominations, this per-member assessment is rather low. United Methodist Churches, for example, can pay around \$200.00 per member. Episcopal costs are still higher (based on a percentage of total congregational budget); even American Baptists - who receive very little support - pay about \$35.00 per member in Association Dues.

So please remember that paying per capita in addition to your pledge helps our congregation to function and provides crucial contacts for a host of regular needs at very little cost. The Per Capita rate (amount per member) for the Presbytery of Genesee Valley in 2026 is \$40.00. Because the work of regional and national bodies helps demonstrate our belief in the Christian connections we proclaim, your per capita donation helps us to remain "connected and connectional"!



Goings-on at General Assembly

In the Presbyterian Church, USA we have no offices of *authority* - only offices of *function*. Our structure assigns different roles to different "councils." Our church Session is a council, as is the Presbytery of Genesee Valley, the Synod of the Northeast, and the General Assembly. Each has its specific areas of responsibility, and each agrees to respect the functions of all other councils.

In the past, change came slowly through the General Assembly. Hotly-debated topics like ordination standards often took fifteen years or more to update. Lately, larger changes have come more frequently - often each time the General Assembly meets. Some of these changes will impact how we function here in the First Presbyterian Church of Honeoye Falls. Over the next months, I'd like to review each of those changes one at a time and show how it may impact our home church.

REORGANIZATION: Our denomination has zero hierarchies - no bishops, Cardinals, or higher bodies. Rather, representatives from local churches volunteer to meet in regional bodies to discern answers to questions assigned to it. Our Per Capita payments pay for the infrastructure necessary to maintain those bodies, including staff. Our national council is called the General Assembly, which meets every two years. Our denomination was the largest in 1983; since then we have shrunk to less than half those 3.1 million members. In response to this change, the General Assembly has addressed how to reduce its national structures. Not as much Per Capita is paid now and the need for national-level action has sharply declined. The nature of this change was debated at the General Assembly for several years.

About six years ago, representatives voted to combine its two national branches into one. In 2024 the Office of the General Assembly and the Presbyterian Mission Agency were each disbanded and duties transferred to one office, called the Interim Unified Agency. Many positions were eliminated and support staff for domestic and mission efforts were greatly reduced. This change was especially hard for the Presbyterian Mission Agency, as over thirty staff who had given their lives to mission work (called "Mission Co-workers") had their positions eliminated. However, the General Assembly and its appointed Unification Commission saw no way to sustain the pre-existing structure.

We will notice these changes in subtle ways. Most of us may notice that the PC USA special offerings - One Great Hour of Sharing, Pentecost Offering, Peace & Global Witness Offering, and Christmas Joy Offering - are now only three: the Pentecost Offering is no longer collected. Some distinct, Presbyterian functions affecting groups like Presbyterian Disaster Assistance and global missions will now be turned over to Synods and Presbyteries. Mostly, this change means less of an organizing role and more of a General-Assembly implementation role at the national level. Representatives available to local churches will most likely decrease, with encouragement to work more with Presbyteries.

The General Assembly also recently approved a new confession, expanded benefits for pastors having children or grieving deaths in the family, and began discussing the ordination of lay ministers. These topics can wait for future newsletters.

Capital Campaign Update

The Capital Campaign Team is pleased and grateful to announce that as of April 2026 we are more than halfway toward our total fundraising goal of \$400,000!!! Many projects have been completed, and the following projects are the next to be addressed:

- Safety Fence above the wall
- Ramp to the church offices
- Repair and Painting of the exterior of the sanctuary & bell tower

UPDATE - During the winter, an inspection of the bell tower was done, resulting in a need to expand the Repair and Painting project. This will require an adjustment of project costs, which will be reported once estimates are received. Some of these added costs will be included in an upcoming grant application, once all estimates are received.



Two successful brunches were held in November and March with interested congregation members - plans have been made to make this a series of brunch gatherings where the Team will share updates, fellowship, and answer questions about the campaign, In addition, the Team plans to send Stewardship letters to congregation members, friends, and past members who have relocated.
